We are pleased to provide you with this Annual Report for 2016. In pursuit of our mission "to provide primary health care to those in need," many important strides were made as we began implementation of our 2016-2017 Strategic Plan (please see page 6).

The Board and Management are holding themselves accountable to improve PCHC in all five areas of the Strategic Plan. Here a few examples of accomplishments that reflect our progress:

Access and Quality:

- Provided a health care home to 1,188 additional patients in 2016, a 5% increase over 2015 (and an all-time high of patients served) of 24,619
- Improved six of seven Healthy People 2020 outcome measures

Workforce:

High rate of employee retention 82% compared to a health care industry range of 70-75%

Delivery of Care Model:

• Patients have access to behavioral health care during their primary care visits

Service Culture:

Developed a plan for organization-wide customer service training

Sustainability:

- Initiated a facilities master plan to assess our long-term space needs
- Increased our cash reserves for future growth

In addition to the progressed noted above, we are most proud of the fact that one out of seven Puebloans trust PCHC with their health care needs. Everything we do at PCHC is focused on maintaining patients' trust. Where we fall short, we try to improve. Where we succeed, we take pride in knowing we are achieving our mission.

Total Patients:

• 24,619

Total Percentage of Patient by Age:

- Children <18 29%</p>
- Adult 18-64 61%
- Geriatric 65+ 10%

Race and Ethnicity:

- 61% of patients at PCHC are of racial and/or ethnic minority The largest percentage of that is comprised of people of Hispanic/Latino ethnicity--57%
- 88% of PCHC patients live at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (FPL at 200% for a family of 4 is annual income of \$48,600 in 2016)
- 51% of PCHC patients live at or below 100% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL at 100% for a family of 4 is annual income of \$24,300 in 2016)

Primary Care Outcomes:

- 18% of patients have hypertension (high blood pressure) 68% of those patients have their blood pressure under control (<140/90)
- 13% of patients have diabetes 58% of those patients have their diabetes under control (HbA1c <=8%)</p>
- 14% of patients have depression
 71% of all patients 12 years and older are screened for depression

14% of patients have accessed PCHC dental services



PCHC Key Strategic Areas

As an independent, non-profit 501(c)3, Pueblo Community Health Center delivers high quality, accessible primary care to the patients it serves. A local Board of Directors governs the organization and the majority of the members are patients, and the balance, community members. They are responsible for setting the direction of the organization and overseeing the management's achievement of its goals and objectives. In 2016, the Board approved a two-year strategic plan that includes focus on the following five Key Strategic Areas (KSAs):



KSA 1 Access and Quality

Intent: PCHC must improve access to care and outcomes for the target population. PCHC must serve its current patient population better. Unless we improve access and quality, we won't be able to reach people whose needs are not yet met.



KSA 2 Workforce Development

Intent: PCHC must attract, develop, and retain service-driven employees.



KSA 3 Delivery of Care Model

Intent: The care model must be consistent with Triple Aim (improved population health, lower per capita costs, and patient engagement) and be sustainable.



KSA 4 Service Culture

Intent: Core Values must be the motivation for all interactions with patients, the public, and with one another.



KSA 5 Sustainability

Intent: PCHC must allocate its resources towards the mission and assure our long-term viability. The organization must have the infrastructure necessary to meet stated goals.
