East Side Clinic = Zero Energy

Most of PCHC's regular donors and supporters have heard about the new Pueblo east side clinic on which ground was broken in October 2020. But many may not realize that this innovative clinic is one of the first of its kind in the entire country. According to the New Buildings Institute, it will be the first emerging zero energy outpatient health care clinic in Colorado.

Most medical facilities are extraordinarily energy intensive, so PCHC made the decision to pursue zero energy building strategies to not only reduce energy costs, but also to reduce the impact on the environment and benefit the Pueblo community in the future. PCHC did adopt a few energy saving features in its construction of the clinic on Colorado Avenue in 2009, but the east side clinic has been designed to produce more energy than it consumes. This forward-thinking construction will contribute to the city of Pueblo's resolution that sets a vision to use 100% renewable energy by 2035.

Conveniently located in one building, the new east side clinic will provide much needed health care services including medical, behavioral health, dental, lab and pharmacy. A bright open layout, including a three-story atrium, coupled with exceptional energy-efficient design and on-site energy production, will provide Pueblo's east side with a beautiful state-of-the-art new clinic. The renewable energy will be produced through a combination of on-site photovoltaic arrays, battery storage, and ground source heat pumps.

"It (zero energy) is an aspect of the project I mention every chance I can, and I think it will shine a very positive light on PCHC and the Pueblo community. I'm very proud that we are delivering this project and achieving such impactful beneficial goals as a result," stated Donald Moore, CEO of PCHC.

Letter from the CEO

Dear Friends,

The east side clinic construction is a once in a generation project. It has been a LOT of work but very satisfying. The Board, staff, and I have a great sense of responsibility in making the project happen. PCHC is ready to provide primary care to those in need for many decades to come.

In addition to ensuring Puebloans have access to quality primary care services, our building project is contributing to the revitalization of the east side and Pueblo. PCHC's new clinic attracted the attention of the Pueblo Urban Renewal Authority, and an urban renewal district designation has been proposed with our clinic at the center of it. The City and County of Pueblo are investing \$1 million in infrastructure improvements throughout the east side neighborhood.



I have been presenting to many community groups lately about our progress. One of my favorite updates to provide is that 87% of our construction subcontractor budget has been awarded to Pueblo companies. It may have been 100% except there were some trades for which no Pueblo companies submitted a bid. Most of the money in a construction project goes to subcontractors and PCHC wanted to keep the money circulating in our community. We competitively bid all jobs, and Pueblo's companies demonstrated the quality we needed for our project. Pueblo workers can take pride in building this new facility in the heart of their own community.

As of March 1st, the project is 42% complete and we still plan completion October 2021. Anything else you'd like to add: In addition to being an essential part of the medical community, PCHC is demonstrating environmental stewardship in the design of our new East Side Clinic. This structure will be a Zero Energy (ZE) building – meaning it will produce as much energy (with rooftop solar panels) to put back into the electrical grid as it takes from the grid. It will not burn fossil fuel. PCHC's East Side Clinic will be the first ZE building in Pueblo, the first ZE medical facility in the state, and one of very few ZE medical facilities in the entire country.
